Health benefits

Altered pets have a much lower risk of reproductive cancers and generally live longer lives. Females will not go in heat (eliminating the messiness and anxious behavior associated with a cycle) or experience any complications during birth. Spayed females have less risk of mammary cancer and no risk of uterine infection or cancer. Males are less likely to engage in undesirable behaviors such as urine marking, humping, aggression and roaming to seek out a mate.

Cost benefits

The initial cost of altering your pet is returned in multiples later in life by not having to treat dangerous cancers or care for litters of pets. With subsidized fees at Pets Alive, you cannot afford to NOT have your pet spayed or neutered.

Wellness

Heartworm prevention available *Heartgard Plus* \$26–\$34 for 6-month supply depending on weight of dog; single doses are available.
